To dear authors (Six)

——what should you pay special attention to for language?

Conciseness and accuracy of language and rigor and refinement of writing reflect scholars' attainment. Without clear and accurate expression, any splendid academic thoughts couldn't be understood and accepted; any excellent academic results couldn't get spread effectively. In papers submitted to our journal, some are obscure and crude in language; some are illogical and inarticulate in content; some are careless and random in expression. These phenomena have a bad impact on adoption of contributions. Therefore, we'd like to remind writers:

- 1. Language in the writing must be accurate and concise. It must state facts and expresses opinions clearly.
- 2. It must be demonstrated clearly what your opinions are and what others' views are when quoting results from others or retailing formulae or axioms from textbooks.
- 3. It's not necessary to form too many levels for writing. Labels of paragraphs should be "—, —, —; (Chinese numbers)" and "1. 2. 3. (Arabic numbers)". Expressions in the whole paper should be adapted to each other rather than be used randomly.
- 4. Understand implications of "based on" and "empirical" accurately and avoid overusing or misusing them.
